CHALICE OR CANDLE LIGHTING OR SOUND A CHIME (2 to 3 minutes for this and silence and opening words)

MOMENT OF SILENCE

OPENING WORDS

Numerous are our origins, our paths, and our destinations. $\begin{bmatrix} I \\ SEP \end{bmatrix}$ And yet, happily, our ways have joined together here today. May our joining be a blessing. $\begin{bmatrix} I \\ SEP \end{bmatrix}$ May it bring comfort to those who are in pain. May it bring hope to those who despair. $\begin{bmatrix} I \\ SEP \end{bmatrix}$ May it bring peace to those who tremble in fear. $\begin{bmatrix} I \\ SEP \end{bmatrix}$ May it bring wisdom and guidance for our journeys. And though this joining may be for just a moment in time, $\begin{bmatrix} I \\ SEP \end{bmatrix}$ the moment is all we can ever be certain of. May we embrace this, and every instant of our lives. CHECK-IN (up to 20 to 30 minutes total with up to 2 to 3 minutes per person)

TOPIC AND SHARING (up to 70 minutes for readings, questions, a few minutes for reflection and making notes if desired, individual sharing, optional open discussion at the end if the group agrees, with an optional 5 minute break about midway in the session)

QUESTIONS (Please respond to whichever question or questions you feel moved to answer. It is not necessary to respond to all of the questions. You may also respond to any of the readings that you find to be particularly meaningful.)

geography, climate, etc.). What transformations occurred in you as a result of those encounters? 2. What differences are most difficult for you to tolerate, and why?

3. What differences or diversity do you anticipate we might encounter in our new church location, and what responses might you have to those encounters?

SHARING (up to 6 to 8 minutes each without interruption, depending on the time available, with optional open discussion at the end after all have shared)

ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS (up to 5-10 minutes)

-Confirm next meeting date, time, location, and topic.

-Consider discussing the service project.

-Hand out or send by e-mail the SGM evaluation forms for the facilitator and the participants. The forms are to be completed prior to or during the next, final, session, and turned in at that session. -Other

LIKES (celebrations, gratitudes, appreciations for needs met) and WISHES (mournings, requests, acknowledgements of needs not met)/CHECK-OUT (a few words or phrases from each who wants to share, up to 5 minutes total)

CLOSING WORDS (2 minutes for words, and closing)

EXTINGUISH THE CHALICE OR CANDLE OR SOUND A CHIME (and additional optional closing ritual if agreed to)
