CHALICE OR CANDLE LIGHTING OR SOUND A CHIME (2 to 3 minutes for this and silence and opening words)

MOMENT OF SILENCE

OPENING WORDS

We look forward to our time together to deepen our understanding, to kindle our compassion, to be strengthened, and to be open to new possibilities.

CHECK-IN (up to 20 to 30 minutes total with up to 2 to 3 minutes per person)

COMPLETION OF THE SGM EVALUATION FORM FOR THE FACILITATORS AND THE PARTICIPANTS (Up to 20 minutes)

The evaluation forms may have been given or sent by paper mail or e-mail to group members ahead of time, or may be distributed at this session. Give the completed paper evaluation forms to the facilitator, who will take or send them to the SGM steering committee or the church office. TOPIC AND SHARING (up to 60 minutes for readings, questions, a few minutes for reflection and making notes if desired, individual sharing, optional open discussion at the end if the group agrees, with an optional 5 minute break about midway in the session)

READINGS

3. What else do you want to share at this last scheduled meeting of this SGM group?

SHARING (up to 6 to 8 minutes each without interruption, depending on the time available, with optional open discussion at the end after all have shared)

ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS (up to 5-10 minutes). Alternatively, this agenda item can be done after the check-in, if the group decides to do that.

LIKES (celebrations, gratitudes, appreciations for needs met) and WISHES (mournings, requests, acknowledgements of needs not met)/CHECK-OUT (a few words or phrases from each who wants to share, up to 5 minutes total)

CLOSING WORDS (2 minutes for words, and closing)
