MORALITY VS. ETHICS

It's understandable why one would think that ethics and morals are the same thing. Both are related to what is right and what is wrong. In fact, there is an important difference between the two terms. In a nutshell, ethics are external. They can be codes of conduct you follow at school or work, or a list of rules to follow in a religion. Morality, on the other hand, is internal. It is your own personal belief about what is right and wrong.

OBJECTIVE VS. SUBJECTIVE MORALITY

In *Quora*, in answer to the question "What is the difference between objective morality and subjective morality?", Barry Goldberg, a self-described Philosopher, Sage, Luminary, Professional Thinking Person, wrote:

Well, it's hard to say for sure whether there even is such a thing as "objective" morality in the first place, but if there were then it would need to be some set of moral rules or guidelines that apply equally to all people, regardless of culture, religion, personal interpretation, etc. Such morality would necessarily need to be based on something inherent to the human condition and not imposed by any external source.

Subjective morality, on the other hand, is when you have different groups or different individuals coming up with their own moral rules and guidelines that are different from those invented by other groups or individuals. Morality derived from religion is a classic example of such subjective morality. Sure, most religions *claim* to get their morals from some sort of omnipotent and omniscient god with a perfect moral sense, but since none of them can agree on what this god has actually said, this morality is by definition subjective to each particular religion (and interpretation of that religion).
